Sam 2 Monitor High Street Out

Mon. 26th August – Sat. 21st September 2024.

The Sam 2 monitor was positioned on lamp post 4 High Street, which is outside 13a, on Monday 26th August 2024. It was positioned to record the volume and speed of vehicles travelling along the High Street from Church Plain towards Beccles Road. It commenced recording at 2.00pm and the data was downloaded at 9.00am on Saturday the 21st of September. As you will no doubt be aware, the time period covered included the last few days of the school summer holiday and the start of the new term. During that time (27 days) it recorded the speed of 50,859 vehicles. The maximum speed of 85% of those vehicles (43,230) was 23mph, whilst the maximum speed recorded was 45mph.

The daily volume of vehicles recorded, were as follows:


