Closer to nature

This is a wonderful section of river with many species of insects and birds enjoying the watery habitats and meadows. Butterflies, bees, reed, sedge, and cettis warblers are just a few of the locals to look out for.

Chedgrave Common

It's here that the accessible path turns back on itself, while the full circular route takes a left through the kissing gates and back along Common Loke.

- Distance: 3.6 km/2.2 miles. Allow 1.25 hours (relaxed pace).
- Surfaces: A mix of pavements and surfaced paths along the river, with unsurfaced driveway and quiet country road and pavements on the return.
- Signage: Fully waymarked – look for the purple Jubilee discs.
- Dogs: Yes, on leads recommended.
- Parking: The walk starts at Loddon Staithe car park. Additional parking can be found at Church Plain.
- Refreshments: Several cafés and pubs can be found in Loddon and Chedgrave.
- Public toilets: Available at Loddon Staithe car park.

From Pits Lane

Accessible via the Wherryman's Way for wheelchairs and pushchairs, Pits Lane turns into an equally open-to-all footpath that follows the course of the River Chet, offering great views across to Pye's Mill picnic spot.
